



The process under way in Nunavik, aimed at improving food security, is part of a broader movement in Canada's Inuit regions, where the levels of food insecurity are significantly higher than in the rest of the country.

The next (third) working session is scheduled for September 2018 and will cover the topic of access to and availability of food in stores.

*The Nunavik Regional Board of Health and Social Services is a public agency created in 1978 under the James Bay and Northern Québec Agreement. It is responsible for nearly the entire Québec territory located north of the 55<sup>th</sup> parallel in terms of the provision of health and social services for the inhabitants of the 14 communities.*
